

The therapeutic steps in Hidradenitis Suppurativa (HS)

Note that not all patients will necessarily reach the last step of treatment.

A combination of treatments is often used.

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SOMETIMES USEFUL OPTIONS (depending on the situation)

Laser hair removal

Surgery

Intralesional injections (Kenalog®)

Pain medications

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MEDICATIONS FOR HS

Antibiotic

Often 12 weeks for anti-inflammatory effect

Depending on the situation

Anti-androgen effect:

- Spironolactone
- Oral contraceptive
- Finasteride
- Metformin

Retinoids:

- Isotretinoin
- Acitretin

Others

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BIOLOGICS AND INNOVATIVE TREATMENTS

Some available medications (adalimumab, secukinumab, bimekizumab and others off-label*)

- Subcutaneous injection
- Self-injection or with assistance
- Vaccination updates recommended

Clinical trials

*Some may be reimbursed in certain situations.

RAMQ criteria

for « médicaments d'exception » coverage:

- Hurley stage II or III
- 2 body areas affected
- 3 abscesses or nodules
- Insufficient response to antibiotics for 3 months
